Did you know that Illinois ranked third in the nation for the most tornadoes in 2024? With tornado season in full swing, preparedness is key to keeping you and your family safe.

- Know the Signs:
- Dark, greenish skies
- Large hail
- Loud, roaring noise (like a freight train)
- Sudden drop in temperature and wind direction changes
- ✓ Have a Safety Plan
- Identify a safe shelter: A basement or interior room on the lowest floor, away from windows.
- Prepare an emergency kit with essentials like water, non-perishable food, flashlights, batteries, first-aid supplies, and important documents.
 - Stay informed: Monitor weather alerts via NOAA weather radio, TV, or smartphone apps.

Take Immediate Action

- If a Tornado Warning is issued, seek shelter immediately.
- Avoid vehicles and mobile homes if caught outside, lie flat in a low-lying area covering your head.
- After the storm, stay away from downed power lines! Check on neighbors and report any hazards including downed trees and blocked roads.

With the "warmest" February on record, Illinois has already seen a high number of tornadoes this year, making it more important than ever to stay alert and prepared!


